Identify and understand your...

- Interests: Things you enjoy doing. Focus 2; Strong Interest Inventory
- Skills: Your abilities, talents, and strengths. Focus 2
- Values: What is most important to you in a job (income, job security, flexibility, leadership, contribution, etc.)? Focus 2; or CA Career Zone (Work Importance Profiler)
- **Personality**: Different personality types tend to have distinct preferences in their choice of careers. *Focus 2 or Keirsey Temperament (available in our office)*
- Leisure Interests: What you enjoy doing and how it can relate to the world of careers. Focus 2
- Lifestyle: How much income do you require and what careers are compatible with your personal lifestyle goals? *CA Career Zone (Reality Check)*

 Work Importance Profiler.



A Word of Caution:

Our website includes links to several useful online assessments. However, we suggest extra caution when using online assessments. Many sites have not been validated as effective career decision tools. Also, assessment results can sometimes be very difficult to evaluate. If you see an undesirable occupation suggested as a good match for you, it does not necessarily mean it is the best match. It is more useful to understand why that occupation appeared. Our counselors are available by appointment to help you through the assessment process.

The Holland Hexagon:

Most career interest assessments are based on the Holland Hexagon. If you discover your "Holland Code," this might help your understanding. The hexagonal model shows the relationship between the personality types and environments. Notice that the personality types closest to each other are more alike than those farther away. You can see this most clearly, when you compare the personalities opposite each other on the hexagon.



- R (Realistic) Doers [hands-on, product orientated]
- I (Investigative) Thinkers [analytical, research orientated]
- A (Artistic) Creators [self-expressive, idea orientated]
- S (Social) Helpers [helpful, service orientated]
- E (Enterprising) Persuaders [persuasive, results orientated]
- C (Conventional) Organizers [orderly, data orientated]

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GETTING STARTED WITH FOCUS 2

When should you use FOCUS 2?



Use FOCUS 2 throughout your college years and as an alumnus. FOCUS 2 can be used in different ways throughout all stages of your education and career planning according to your personal needs.

1st or 2nd year student:

- Understand the career planning process
- Self awareness learn about yourself through the assessments
- Explore majors at your college that match your interests and support your career goals
- Explore career fields and occupations that appeal to you
- Develop an Action Plan
- Make informed decisions about your major and career

Upper Classman and Alumnus:

- Ongoing career exploration and awareness
- Gain experience; Make career plans
- Plan for advanced education and training
- Explore future options for transitioning into specialized occupations

How much time does it take to use FOCUS 2?

Typically, the total time spent by students the first time they use FOCUS 2 ranges from 1 to 2 hours. Of course, you can spend as much time as you wish.

The Career Readiness & Self Assessment modules of FOCUS 2 can usually be completed in approximately 45 minutes. You can login at any time to spend additional time researching over 1,000 occupations.

A good strategy after using FOCUS 2 is to think about your results and discuss your ideas with your career counselor, advisor or professor. Be sure to continue to use FOCUS 2 as an ongoing resource.

How to set up your account and log in to FOCUS 2

New Users:

Create your account by registering for FOCUS 2. You can link to the registration and log in pages for FOCUS 2 from: http://bit.ly/focus2fresnostate or click on Focus 2 icon on the main page at www.fresnostate.edu/careers

- <u>Returning Users</u>: Access your account anytime by entering your username and password on the log in page for FOCUS 2. The log in is cAse seNsitive.

- Use FOCUS 2 online on any phone, tablet, PC or MAC computer or IPAD anywhere, anytime.
- FOCUS 2 always saves your results.
- You can change your mind about earlier choices, repeat a section and explore new options.
- Your results are stored online and are always available to you and your career counselor/adviser.
- Remember to save the majors and occupations that appeal to you as you review them.
