### **CA Dream Act**



### **Who Should Renew the Application?**

**EVERYONE** who is attending a CA college/university for next academic year 2023-2024 and meets the AB540 criteria. Even if you have exhausted Cal grant eligibility, remember there is still other forms of financial aid available to students if you qualify. Check It Out

This means any student (1st year and beyond) should apply to renew the CA Dream Act:

- currently enrolled students (Freshmen Senior year)
- Super Seniors (attending school past the 4th year)
- Students applying to the Credential program
- Students applying to a Graduate Program (Masters)

If you think you no longer have Cal grant eligibility, **no** worries! You can still get other aid (if eligible) like

Institutional Aid, so renew EARLY.

#### Need More Money? Apply to the Fresno State Scholarship

In addition to the CA Dream Act please apply to the Fresno State Scholarship if you are attending Fresno State for 2023–2024. The application Opens in October and closes in May. Apply now!




### **Learning Center**
