Most unmarried undergraduates under the age of 24 are considered dependent for federal financial aid purposes and, therefore, must provide parental information on the FAFSA. If your parents have ended all financial support and refuse to provide their information on your FAFSA, then you may submit this petition to receive only unsubsidized loans. To submit this petition, you may not receive any financial support whatsoever from a parent, including living at home with a parent, using a vehicle owned by a parent, having a parent co-sign any loan, or receiving health or car insurance through a parent.

Pros and Cons to Submitting a FAFSA without Parent Income Information.

- Pros:** A federal unsubsidized loan is better than alternative/private education loans and credit cards. Some federal aid is better than no federal aid. Federal student loans do not involve checking a student's credit rating.
- Cons:** Only an unsubsidized loan (the least desirable federal student loan) can be awarded. You will be ineligible for the Pell Grant, SEOG Grant, need-based scholarships, work-study, federal subsidized loans, and Parent PLUS Loans. The amount of an unsubsidized loan is limited to the annual grade level limit for dependent students (freshman \$5,500; sophomore \$6,500; junior/senior \$7,500) and the lifetime limit. How to Submit a Petition for Dependent Students without Parental Help

1. Ask your parents to complete page 2 of this document. They must initial each statement on page 2, sign the petition, and provide the date when financial support ended. (If your parents refuse to complete this form, please attach a letter from a third party, such as a teacher, counselor, or cleric.)

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) requires parental information for most unmarried undergraduates under the age of 24. To complete this Petition, ask your parents, who have ended all financial support and refuse to provide information on your FAFSA, to complete this page. The parent's information that would have been used on your FAFSA is your biological parent or your legally adopted parent. Include your stepparent if your biological or adoptive parent has remarried. (**Note:** Grandparents, foster parents, and legal guardians are not considered parents for the purposes of FAFSA.)

Determine whether only one or both of your parents need to sign this form.

Both parents' signatures are required in the following circumstances:

- If your legal parents are married to each other or living together, then both parents need to sign this form.
- If your biological or adoptive parent has remarried, your stepparent also needs to sign this form.

Only one parent's signature is required in the following circumstances:

- If your parent has never been married and does not live with your other legal parent.
- If your parent is widowed and has not remarried.
- If your parent is divorced or legally separated and not remarried, determine which parent will sign this form by the ranked criteria below:

- Financial need-based scholarships
