Upper-Division Transfer Requirements - Fall 2014

NOTE: Please refer to www.csumentor.edu to receive the latest information on admission requirements and deadlines for transfer applicants.

Fresno State is impacted at the transfer level and will implement supplementary criteria for admission. Based on space availability, transfer applicants from the Local Area will be accommodated first. Transfer applicants from other college or universities will be considered if they have a recommended G.P.A. of 2.75 or higher. Information regarding impaction can be found at www.FresnoState.edu/are

All requirements below must be completed by the end of the spring 2014 semester to be considered for admission for the fall semester.

- Completion of 60 or more transferable units (90 quarter units).
- Completion of a minimum of 30 semester units (45 quarter units) of General Education (G.E.) with a 2.0 G.P.A. or better.
- Completion of the four Foundation classes (area A1, A2, A3 & B4) with a grade of C or better.
- A cumulative transfer G.P.A. of 2.0 or better is required from Local Area applicants; 2.75 or better is recommended for applicants outside the service area.
- Must be in "good standing" at the last college or university attended. Good standing means you are eligible to re-enroll at your last college or university.

Important Notice from the Admissions Office

Transfer applications **will not** be reviewed until transcripts are received from **all** institutions attended. If enrolled in fall classes, please be sure fall final grades are posted before you send transcripts from that institution. If you are in the process of completing the above admission requirements you will be **Conditionally Admitted**. You will be invited to participate in Dog Days (new student orientation); however, you will not be able to register for classes and be officially admitted until transcripts with final spring grades are received. What's New! California Community Colleges (CCC) Students The Student Transfer Achievement Reform (STAR) Act www.sb1440.org

Student who earn the Associates in Arts degree for Transfer (AA-T) or the Associate in Science degree for Transfer (AS-T) will be granted priority admission to the California State University (CSU) into a similar baccalaureate (BA) degree program with a guarantee of junior standing as long as the student meets all prescribed admission requirements. Once admitted, the student will only be required to complete 60 additional prescribed units to qualify for the similar baccalaureate degree. **SB 1440** does not guarantee a student admission for a specified major or campus, but requires the CSU to grant a student priority admission consideration to the local CSU campus and to a program or major that is similar to the transfer AA degree as determined by the CSU.

After you apply, your next step is to create a Fresno State student account.

Just follow these simple steps:

MY.FRESNOSTATE.EDU

Go to my.fresnostate.edu. You will need your Fresno State new student ID number sent to you by the Admissions Office. You will create a new account with a username and password specific to you. Once you have created this account, it will be the same username and password for your campus email, My Fresno State, Blackboard, free campus Wi-Fi and other services available to Fresno State students.

After you create an account you are ready to login to the My Fresno State portal at my.fresnostate.edu.

- To access your **Student Center**: Under My Menu > select Student Self Service > select Student Center
- Once on the Student Center page, you can view your:
 - o **To Do List**: Documents requested by a specific office or program that you still need to complete. For further information select the item in question.
 - o **Application status**: > select My Admissions Information > select Application Status
 - o **Register for Dog Days**: > select My Admissions Information > select Dog Days: New Student Orientation (after you have been conditionally admitted)
 - o **Financial Aid**: > select My Finances (Financial Obligations and Financial Aid), here you can select > Account Inquiry or > View Financial Aid or > Accept/Decline Awards

Financial Aid, Scholarships and Costs

Financial Aid

Financial assistance is available to students and families of all income levels. You do not need a notice of admission to apply for financial aid, however admission is required before an actual award is processed.

STEPS TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Step 1) Apply for a PIN (*personal identification number*) through www.pin.ed.gov. In order for you and your parent (*if required*) to sign and file your FAFSA electronically, each of you must have a PIN.

Step 2) Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov. Priority filing period is January 1-March 2, 2014. California residents who wish to apply for a Cal Grant award must file a FAFSA and submit a certified G.P.A. verification form postmarked no later than March 2. Check with your current school regarding their method of submitting G.P.A.'s.

Step 3) After you apply, you may check your status on line at my.fresnostate.edu. If you have additional questions, you may visit the Financial Aid Office in the Joyal Administration Building, Room 296 or call 559.278.2182.

Important:

- Establish an email account with Fresno State after you apply for admission. This address will be used by the Financial Aid Office to email correspondence to you.
- Be sure to keep copies of your financial aid application and all documents submitted. Also respond to all document requests in a timely manner.
- For an early estimate of your eligibility for federal student financial assistance visit: www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov.

Fresno State Scholarships – Recognizing your talents and achievements

Nonresident tuition - Out-of-state tuition for nonresident and foreign students is \$372 per unit in addition to tuition and other fees.

AB 540 - Undocumented students who have attended a California high school for at least 3 years or have graduated from a California high school may be eligible to pay in-state registration fee. Students can visit www.ab540.com for financial assistance opportunities.

The California Dream Act

AB 130 - allows students who meet AB 540 criteria (California Education Code 68130.5(a)) to apply for and receive non-state funded scholarships for public colleges and universities.

AB 131 - allows students who meet AB 540 criteria to apply for and receive state-funded financial aid such as institutional grants, community college fee waivers, Cal Grant and Chafee Grant. California Dream Act applicants will have to submit a paper "NON-SSN Cal Grant GPA Verification Form" by March 2 to be considered for Cal Grants.
