Admissions Requirements



First-Time Freshmen

- Be a high school graduate or equivalent;
- Complete approved 15- unit comprehensive high school "a-g" courses;
- Earn a qualifying "a-g" grade point average (GPA).

Upper-Division Transfer

- Have completed at least 60 semester (90 quarter) units of transferable college credit, of which 30 semester (45 quarter) units are at a level equivalent to general education courses;
- Have attained a grade point average of 2.0 or better across all transferable college courses attempted. For impacted majors, a higher GPA may be required;
- Be in good standing at the last college or university attended. In other words, "good standing" means you are eligible to re-enroll at your last college or university;
- Have completed with a grade of C- or better one course in each of the following four areas: Area 1 - English Communication: 1A - Written Communications, 1B - Critical Thinking, 1C - Oral Communications; Area 2 - Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning

Lower Division Transfer

- Completed "a-g" course requirements in high school;
- Graduated from high school (received a high school diploma or General Educational Development, or GED, certificate);
- Meet the Eligibility Index required of a first-time freshman;
- Achieved an overall college GPA of at least 2.00 (This GPA is calculated using all your transfer units attempted. In case of high-demand majors, a GPA of 2.00 may not be sufficient to be admitted);
- Be in good standing at the last college or university you attended. (In simple terms, "good standing" means you are eligible to re-enroll at your last college or university);
- Completed with a grade of C- or better, a foundation course in GE Area 1A in written communication and a foundation course in GE Area 2 in mathematics or quantitative reasoning.

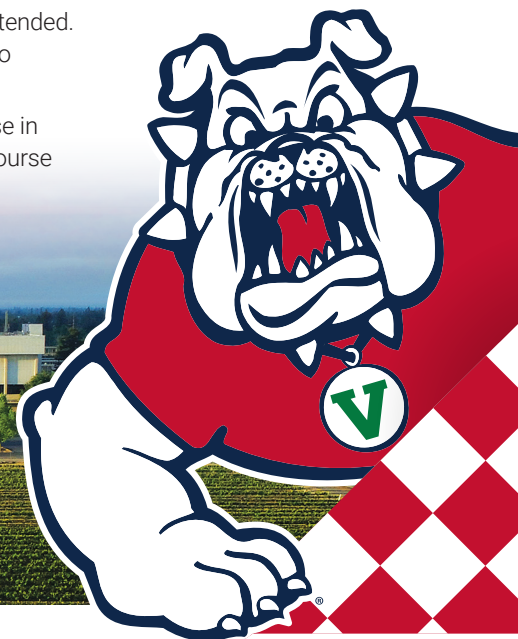
Estimated Cost of Attendance
