“Auntie” Wendy Nelson served the campus of Fresno State for 20 years by supporting students toward success. Though she retired in August 2023, our community can still feel her profound commitment to early outreach and exposure to higher education. In her most recent role, Auntie Wendy served our community as the African American Initiative (AAI) campus coordinator. She was the only coordinator of her kind throughout the California State University (CSU) system. She served as the AAI Outreach Coordinator for six years, creating seminal events like Super Saturday and Super Science. Auntie Wendy’s legacy lives on as we celebrate the monumental Super Saturday event, which is the pinnacle of intentional early outreach to the Black community and the Central Valley as a whole.

The Black Student Success Initiative would like to salute our matriarch, Auntie Wendy, for her diligence and innovation in creating our annual Student Success College and Career Summit (formerly

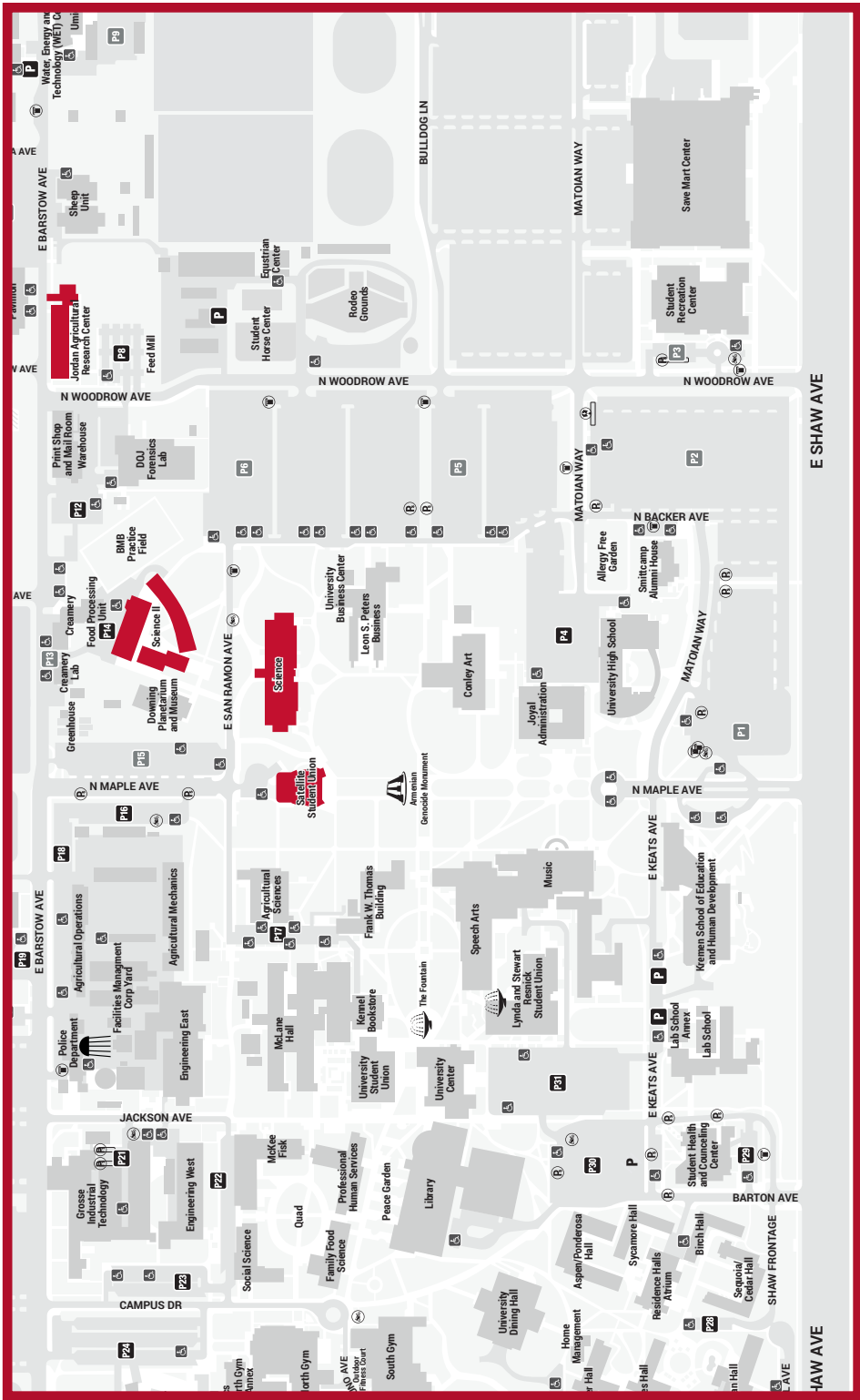

Cory Hall is a former NFL safety, Lean Six Sigma Black Belt, derivatives strategy author, and private equity fund manager. Drafted 65th overall in the 1999 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals, he earned All-Pro Rookie Team honors and later played for the Atlanta Falcons (2002–2005). A four-year starter at Fresno State and 2009 Top Dog Award inductee, Cory holds a Bachelor's degree in Organizational Management and a Master's in Sports Management and Physical Education.

He is the author of *Mastering Puts and Calls: A Beginner's Course on Cash-Secured Puts and Covered Calls*, a foundational guide for new options traders seeking consistent, risk-managed income. Cory made history as the first African American head football coach in Clovis Unified's 50-year history, leading Clovis North to two Valley Championships and league titles in all three seasons. He has coached over 10 NFL draft picks and 20 Division I athletes. His collegiate coaching résumé includes roles at Wisconsin, Oregon State (Interim Head Coach), Central Michigan (Interim Head Coach), and Weber State. A former real estate developer in Atlanta, Cory now equips solopreneurs through equity investing, business procurement, and financial literacy education. He has also executive produced two feature films and one television pilot. Cory is a devoted husband, proud father, and lifelong builder of leaders across industries.
