Chaperones

- Students are required to be under direct supervision for this event
- Chaperones are responsible for monitoring and staying with youth <u>at all times</u>
- Chaperones must use good judgment and language at all times
- Go over rules and expectations with your youth Youth need to show respect during presentations, and follow the code of conduct at all times
- Be sure youth are in the correct workshops
- Do not allow youth to use cell phones during presentations and show respect to elders at all times

Engage

- Be a role model by participating
- Engage and show interest in topics
- Ask your youth questions about the event
- Show respect to elders and presenters

Schedule

- Follow the agenda (know what's happening)

- Listen, stay organized and focused Know where restrooms, workshops etc. are located Cooperate and assist in agenda transitions of the event

Volunteers

- Assist with agenda transitions of the event
- Help youth and participants to their workshops
- Know event staff names, and locations of event activities and workshops
- Help event stay on schedule
- Registration, Workshop, Preparing, etc. are all areas available to help with
